About the Buccaneers

Tonight's game with Coastal Carolina will be the last of a five-game road swing for East Tennessee State, its longest stretch away from home of the season. The game also marks the second straight contest for the Bucs against a school from the Big South Conference. Last Wednesday, ETSU picked up its first road win of the season, coming back from 12 points down to defeat UNC Asheville, 77-71. Freshman **Tiras Wade** led a group of four Bucs in double figures, netting a career-high 19 points. Sophomore **Zakee Wadood** was a perfect 6-of-6 and pulled down eight rebounds. He now leads the team in rebounding, averaging 6.8 boards a game, while Wade moved into the team's top spot in the scoring department, averaging 13.4 points a game.

Quick Shots

The Bucs are 1-3 this season and were 7-7 on the road last season ... ETSU has won both games in which it has outrebounded its opponent ... The game with Coastal is the second of three straight against Big South opponents ... ETSU is 25-14 all-time against the current members of the Big South ... ETSU has had more steals than its opponent in its last four games ... The Bucs' 36 free throw attempts and 22 free throws made at UNCA were their most of the season ... In non-conference road play ETSU was 2-4 last year, it is 1-3 this season ... ETSU has trailed in every game this season at the half but two... The Bucs have averaged nearly 10 steals over the last four games ... ETSU has had at least three players in double figures in scoring in every game.

Series Against The Chanticleers

This will be the sixth meeting between East Tennessee State and Coastal Carolina in a series that began in 1987. The Chants leads the series, 3-2. Coastal Carolina won the last meeting between the schools, taking a 67-61 overtime win at home in 1998. Overall on the Coastal Carolina home floor the teams have split the two games played there. ETSU's win on the road in the series was a 74-72 victory in 1988.

Last Time Out

Led by freshman **Tiras Wade's** 19 points, East Tennessee State used a big second half rally, overcoming a 12-point halftime deficit to defeat UNC Asheville, 77-71 at the Asheville Civic Center. The win was the Bucs's first on the road this season, breaking a three-game losing streak to improve their record to 2-3. UNC Asheville fell to 0-5. It was the first time that ETSU has defeated the Bulldogs in Asheville.

UNC Asheville came out in the first half with a hot shooting hand from the outside, hitting 6-of-10 three-point attempts. The Bulldogs connected on their first three long-range attempts, and took an early 13-5 lead on Brand Carter's trey with 16:36 to play in the half. ETSU on the other hand, was having a cold first half, shooting only 32 percent from the field and committing 12 turnovers. As a result ETSU could not close the gap, and the Bulldogs, led by Carter's nine points, opened up a 40-28 lead at the half.

Sophomore **Zakee Wadood** got the Bucs's comeback started with a layup three minutes into the half that cut the UNCA lead to nine. He then hit a three-pointer that cut the lead down to six at 45-39 with 15:11 to play. ETSU kept chipping away, and when Wadood, who was a perfect 6-for-6 from the field, hit another jump shot with 11:30 left, the Bulldog lead was down to four at 53-49.

Wade then took over the game, going on a personal 9-0 run over the next two minutes that put ETSU in the lead for good. When he was done, the Bucs had a 59-53 lead with 8:49 left to play. Wade, who scored 16 of his points in the second half, hit another shot with 5:12 left that gave ETSU a 70-59 lead.

UNC Asheville did not go without a fight, however, and cut the lead down to three points on Ben McGonagil's dunk with 18 seconds left in the game. UNCA then fouled Wade, who made one of his two shots, but on the Bulldogs' next possession Colin Shaw threw the ball away on an inbounds pass. **Dimeco Childress** then iced the win with a slam after cutting in behind the UNC Asheville defense.

Wade led all scorers with his 19 points, while also adding four steals. **Jerald Fields** added 14 points, five rebounds and three blocked shots. Wadood finished with 15 points and a team best eight rebounds, while **Cliff Decoster** had a season-high 11 points while adding five assists. UNC Asheville was led by McGonagil and Carter, who each had 13 points.

Defense Does It

Last season East Tennessee State's defense was one of its keys for success. The Bucs allowed opponents to shoot at just a .399 clip, the best mark by an ETSU defense in school history. Six times the Bucs held its opponents to under 35 percent shooting, going 5-1 in those contests. The Bucs 279 steals was the fourth best mark in the record books. The Buc defense is acting tough again after five games this season, holding opponents to a .427 mark, blocking 23 shots and grabbing 42 steals.

Defense Back?: A key to East Tennessee State's season this year could again be its defense. It that proves to be the case the Bucs could be in good shape this season. Three of the top four steals totals from a year ago are back in 2001-02. Cliff Decoster (52), Ryan Lawson (43) and Dimeco Childress (33), accounted for nearly 46 percent of last season's total. The trio is back at again this season, accounting for 19 of the team's 42 thefts so far.

What's Back: In terms of the hard numbers, this is what is back for East Tennessee State this season: 59 percent of the scoring, 48 percent of the rebounding, 56 percent of the assists, 59 percent of the blocks and 61 percent of the steals.

The Experience Factor

Experience could be a key factor for East Tennessee State this season. At a glance, the Bucs return three starters, including the team's top two scorers, **Dimeco Childress** (13.2 ppg) and **Cliff Decoster** (9.3 ppg). The other two projected starters, **Jerald Fields** and **Corey Seels** saw substantial action, with Seels playing in all but one game and Fields all but five. Beyond the projected starters the experience is thin, with only **Isaac Potter** and **Zakee Wadood** able to come off the bench with any experience from last season. They each averaged less than 10 minutes a game.

Newcomer Power

If the first five games are any indication, experience might not be that much of a factor. Led by **Tiras Wade**, the team's group of six newcomers have had an immediate impact in the scoring column so far this season. Wade has led the team in scoring twice and currently leads the squad in scoring average with his 13.4 mark. He is making a mark for himself with some flashy play, highlighted by his UNC Asheville game in which he scored 12 points of a 14-0 run by the Bucs that put them into the lead. For good measure, he also added a career-high four steals. Just five games in he is among the team leaders in scoring, rebounding, steals and assists.

The 'Z' Factor

While he is not one of the newcomers that are making impacts, sophomore **Zakee Wadood** has also been making his presence felt so far this season, adding some much needed punch to the Bucs inside game. After shooting under 40 percent and averaging three points as a freshman, Wadood has become one of the team's biggest threats off bench this season, shooting at a 51 percent clip and averaging 12.4 points and 6.8 boards a game.

Off The Bench

With the strong play of the newcomers this season, East Tennessee State's bench has played a large part in each of the Bucs games this season. **Tiras Wade** and **Zakee Wadood** are both averaging in double figures as subs to lead the group. So far this season the Bucs' bench has outscored the opponents reserves in each game but one (South Carolina) and outrebounded them in every game. ETSU's bench is averaging 36.4 points and 17.4 rebounds a game compared to the opponents 21.8 points and 12.6 boards.

Digging A Hole

The first half of games has proved to be somewhat troublesome this season for ETSU. Opponents have scored an average of over 40 points in the first 20 minutes of action compared to 33 for the Bucs. Three times ETSU has trailed at the half, with an average deficit of 15.7. In the two games the Bucs have had the lead at the half, it has only been by an average of 4.5 points.

North Division Champions

East Tennessee State earned its first-ever Southern Conference North Division championship in 2000-01. The Bucs finished the SoCon slate with a 13-3 record, the best mark of any SoCon member.

Coach of the Year

For the first time in his career, head coach **Ed DeChellis** earned the 2001 Southern Conference Coach of the Year after leading the Bucs to the best record of any SoCon member. The last ETSU coach to earn the honor was Les Robinson in 1990.

Veteran Backcourt

All three starters from last season's talented backcourt return for the 2001-02 campaign. Senior **Cliff Decoster** returns to run the point for the third consecutive season and is only one assist away from moving into 10th-place on the ETSU all-time assists list. Senior **Dimeco Childress** can score and rebound from his three-guard spot and led the team in scoring (13.2 ppg) last season while Decoster ranked second (9.3 ppg). Junior **Ryan Lawson** also returns turns as the Bucs' shooting guard. Last season he led the team in three-point shooting percentage with a mark of .386.

Kings Of Swat

East Tennessee State is off to a record-setting pace this season in the blocked shots department. So far the team has recorded 23 blocks, an average of 4.6 per game. At that rate the Bucs would break the school record of 118 set in the 1991-92 season. Sophomore **Jerald Fields** has been leading the way, with his six blocked shots against Guilford tying the school record set by ETSU all-time leading scorer, Greg Dennis. Dennis set the mark against Western Carolina on Feb. 17, 1992. With three more blocks at UNC Asheville, Fields now totals 13 for the season after swatting away 17 shots all of last year.

Slow Start

Senior **Cliff Decoster** has been plagued by a slow start so far in the 2001-02 season. He has started every game and leads the team with 20 assists, but has averaged only 5.4 points. At Virginia he did not score a point; only the second time that has happened since he became the Bucs starter at the point in his sophomore season. He showed signs of coming out of his slump at UNC Asheville, getting a season-high 11 points and hitting 7-of-9 free throw attempts. He has led the team in assists in four of the five games.

Deadeye

ETSU is getting the job done at the free throw line this season, hitting on 67 percent of its attempts compared to 62 percent last season. Still, opponents outscored the Bucs by 11 from the line. ETSU had its shooting eye working at the free throw line at Virginia, hitting 12-of-13 attempts (.923); one of the best marks in school history. The record is a 12-of-12 performance against N.C. State in 1992.

Bombs Away

Opponents have been bombing away from three-point range against the Bucs this season at an alarming rate, shooting from long-range at a 38 percent clip. They have hit 40 three-point baskets so far, nearly a third of the field goals scored against ETSU. In three of the five games opponents have shot better than 40 percent from behind the arc, including hitting better than 44 percent in the last two outings. On the other hand, ETSU has struggled from three-point land, hitting only 31 percent of its shots. Opponents have made an average of 8.0 treys per game compared to 4.8 for the Bucs.

Bucs Picked Third

East Tennessee State was picked to finish third in the North Division of the Southern Conference this season in a vote of members of the media at the SoCon Basketball Tip-Off earlier this year. Full results of the poll are:

An All-Southern Conference Performer

ETSU's **Dimeco Childress** earned All-Southern Conference honors after a stellar junior season. His most impressive performance was at Vanderbilt where he netted a career-high 30 points, including knocking down seven three-pointers. His seven treys in that contest tied for second on ETSU's all-time single-game list.

The Florida Connection

Of the 15 players on the ETSU roster this season, five list Florida as their home state, with a sixth player, **Cory Seels**, playing high school ball in the Sunshine State. Senior **Cliff Decoster** is the only upperclassman from Florida, and is joined by sophomore **Jerald Fields** (Gainesville) and freshmen **James Anthony** (Brandon), **Keeton Brooks** (Tampa) and **Tiras Wade** (Tampa). Brooks and Wade were teammates at Tampa Tech High School. In addition the Bucs have the last two *Tampa Tribune* Florida Player-of-the-Year recipients - Seels (2000) and Wade (2001).

Home Sweet Dome

The Bucs have won 10 consecutive games in the Memorial Center, including all eight Southern Conference games last season. ETSU was 11-2 at home during the 2000-01 season.

More Out-Of-Town News

ETSU also faces a road challenge to begin the Southern Conference schedule, hitting the road for four of the first six games in conference play. The Bucs open with a home game with Appalachian State before swinging through Charleston, S.C. for games against The Citadel and the College of Charleston. After a home contest against VMI, the Bucs play at UNC Greensboro and at Davidson.

Series Sweep

Last season, the Bucs swept their regular season series against Appalachian State for the first time since the 1994-95 season. ETSU also swept its series from every member of the SoCon North Division except for UNC Greensboro. The Bucs have not swept the Spartans in the four years they have been a member of the conference. The teams have split the season series all four years.
