2003 Season: Played an instrumental role in guiding ETSU to its first-ever Southern Conference tournament championship game, and earned all-tournament recognition ... was a second-team All-SoCon selection as well as the team's MVP ... went 14-10 as the team's ace, spending 178.1 innings on the mound ... set single-season records after leading the Bucs in ERA (2.36), opposing batting average (.247), and shutouts (5), on top of leading the team in strikeouts (83), and saves (5) ...
