Buc Shots

A seven-time NCAA Tournament participant and two-time NIT participant, the ETSU Buccaneers ended the 2007-08 season coming off a regular season Atlantic Sun Conference championship with a 24-10 overall record, a 16-2 league mark a year ago ... The Bucs return the 2006-07 A-Sun Player of the Year in junior guard **Courtney Pigram** (Memphis), as well as the A-Sun Coach of the Year **Murry Bartow** and All A-Sun Freshman team pick **Mike Smith** (Vandalia, Mo.) ... Along with returning players like Pigram and Smith, the Bucs also return significant contributors to last season's success such as senior post **Andrew Reed** (Port Richey, Fla.), sophomore point guard **Dequan Twilley** (Shelbyville), senior forward **Kenyona Swader** (Smyrna), and senior guard **Travis Strong** (Memphis) ... Newcomers for the Bucs that are expected to contribute early and often include junior college transfer **Kevin Tiggs** (Flint, Mich.), who was the JuCo Division II National Player of the Year last season, and lightning quick JuCo point guard **Jacolby Davis** (Meridian, Miss.) ... Several Bucs finished last season leading A-Sun statistical categories, see page 6 of this notebook for more information on those players and their rank ... In addition, see where the Bucs ranked as a team and individually in the NCAA charts last season on page 4.

The series against Mars Hill

While the Bucs and the Lions have met eight times in regular season play with the teams sharing a 4-4 record, the two teams have only met in exhibition play recently ... The first meeting between the schools came in 1925 ... A year ago in exhibition action, the Bucs dropped Mars Hill, 98-67 ... The last regular season meeting between the two teams came in 2003, with ETSU winning 100-57.

Last time against Mars Hill

JOHNSON CITY, Tenn. (Nov. 4, 2006) – With a starting five that featured three true freshmen and a sophomore, a young ETSU men's basketball team took to the floor for the first time this 2006-07 season and dropped Mars Hill, 98-67, in front of 3,601 fans at Memorial Center ... Six Bucs reached double figures, with sophomore guard **Courtney Pigram** (Memphis), freshman guard **Mike Smith** (Vandalia, Mo.), junior forward **Kenyona Swader** (Smyrna, Tenn.) and freshman forward **Petrus Balocka** (Vilnius, Lithuania) leading the way with 16 points apiece. Also reaching double figures were freshman forward **Blake Mishler** (Metamora, Ill.) and senior forward **Brad Nuckles** (Council, Va.) with 12 and 11 points, respectively ... With 21 assists in the game, the Bucs showed a significantly different offensive style with point guards **Dequan Twilley** (Shelbyville, Tenn.) and **Taylor Taylor** (Memphis) at the controls. In fact, Twilley finished with seven assists and just one turnover, and helped guide the Bucs to a 13-point halftime lead at 45-38 ... In the second half, the Bucs kept the pressure on with Balocka scoring all of his points and grabbing eight of his nine rebounds after the intermission. Swader also showed his versatility in the game, hitting on 7-of-10 from the field, dunking a missed shot off the rim, and grabbing six rebounds. When the dust settled, the Bucs had a 31-point win ... As a team, the Bucs shot 58 percent from the floor and 84 percent from the foul line. ETSU also picked up nine steals in the game and out-rebounded Mars Hill 47-29 ... For the Lions, Stoney Polite led the way with 16 points, while teammates Jarred Pickering and Chris Aline each scored 11 and 10 points, respectively.

Last time out

CLEMSON, S.C. (March 14, 2007) – Sophomore guard **Courtney Pigram** (Memphis) scored a game high 25 points and senior **Brad Nuckles** (Council, Va.) eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau for his career, but the Clemson Tigers used a dominating performance on the glass to drop ETSU 64-57 and survive a first round match up with the Buccaneers in the National Invitation Tournament inside Littlejohn Coliseum ... Despite being held to just 38 percent shooting by the ETSU defense, Clemson out-rebounded the Bucs 51-32 – 19-6 on the offensive end of the floor – to overcome a 49-48 deficit late in the game and hold on for the win. With the victory, Clemson (22-10) advances to the second round of the NIT where it will face the winner of Appalachian State/Ole Miss. Meanwhile, the Bucs (24-10) watched their season come to a close after winning a regular season Atlantic Sun Conference championship and making postseason play for the third time in five seasons ... In the first half, Clemson took an early 7-2 lead only to see the Bucs put together an six-point spurt and go on top 8-7 with 14:57 left on the clock. From there, the Tigers responded with a 10-0 run of their own over the next four minutes to take a 17-8 advantage. Nuckles finally ended a four minute offensive drought for the Bucs with a pair of foul shots and ETSU ended a 9-0 run of its own with a **Mike Smith** (Vandalia, Mo.) 3-pointer at the 7:25 mark to tie the game at 17 ... The Bucs grabbed their second lead of the game with 4:57 left before the intermission, when an **Andrew Reed** (Port Richey, Fla.) jumper found the bottom of the net to make it 21-19. Clemson then manufactured their third significant run of the half, outscoring the Bucs 10-0 to go up 29-21. ETSU rallied, however, thanks to baskets from Smith and Pigram, making it 29-25 at the break. The Tigers dominated the glass in the first 20 minutes, out-rebounding ETSU 29-15. However, Clemson shot just 33 percent from the floor and turned the ball over 13 times on seven ETSU steals, helping to keep the Bucs within striking distance ... While Clemson opened the second half with a 3-pointer to take the lead to 32-25, ETSU bounced back with a 6-0 run to make it 32-31 and force the Tigers to take a 30 second time out to stop the bleeding. Later, ETSU actually had a chance to take the lead on a missed lay up by Pigram, but the Tigers took advantage with a 4-0 run to make it 40-35. The Bucs answered to stay within one for the next several minutes, and at 46-45, Pigram was fouled and went to the line with a chance to give ETSU their first lead of the second half with 7:49 remaining in the contest. Pigram hit one of two to tie the game, but moments later, the Bucs actually managed to finally take a lead on a lay up by **Eryk Thomas** (Fremont, Calif) with 6:48 remaining ... Clemson forward Trevor Booker then took the game on his shoulders, scoring six of eight points in a 9-2 Clemson run to make it 57-51 with just over four minutes left in the game. Nuckles hit a lay up to take his career scoring number to 1,001 and bring the Bucs back to four points at 57-53, but from there ETSU could not get any closer despite the fact Clemson missed several foul shots down the stretch.

Another championship banner

With a win against Stetson (2/22), the Bucs wrapped up an outright 2006-07 A-Sun regular season title and garnered the No. 1 seed in the week's league championship tournament ... For ETSU, it was the continuation of a recent string of success that dates back to the 2000-2001 season ... In all, the Bucs have captured championships in five of the last seven seasons, including back-to-back NCAA Tournament trips in 2002-03 and 2003-04, and a trip to the NIT in 2006-07 ... Here is the championship breakdown:

- 2000-2001** -- Southern Conference North Division Championship
- 2001-2002** -- SoCon North Division championship

Pigram closing in on 1,000 points

Beginning just his third season at ETSU, junior guard **Courtney Pigram** (Memphis) has the pinnacle mark of 1,000 points scoring clearly in his sights already ... Currently standing at 939 points for his career, Pigram is just 61 points shy of 1,000 ... The 6-1 shooting guard scored 325 points as a freshman and then netted a remarkable 614 as a sophomore ... His 614 points a year ago ranks 6th on the single season all-time list.

A great season in 2006-07

With 16 wins in its last 19 games a year ago, ETSU enjoyed a 2006-07 record of 24-10 overall, 16-2 in A-Sun play ... It was the best overall and conference record for the Bucs since the 2003-04 season ... That season, the Bucs were 27-6 and 15-1 in Southern Conference play, losing by three points to Cincinnati in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Bucs dominate Preseason All A-Sun Picks

Last season, ETSU won its first Atlantic Sun Conference men's basketball title, but Belmont denied the Buccaneers the conference's automatic bid in the final of the General Shale Brick Men's Basketball Championship ... Entering the 2007-08 season, both the coaches and the media predict that the Buccaneers will again be battling the Bruins for conference supremacy ... Both chose ETSU as the favorite to win the conference and defend its regular-season title with Belmont second ... The Bucs were the clear choice by the media to win the tournament ... The Buccaneers, who have gone 28-10 in A-Sun play in their two years in the league, will continue to be led by **Courtney Pigram** (Memphis). The junior from Memphis, Tenn. was named the preseason Player of the Year following up his Player of the Year award for the 2006-07 season. As a sophomore, Pigram averaged 18.1 points per game, second-best in the conference and also ranked in the top 10 in steals (2nd, 2.62 SPG), 3-point field goals per game (3rd, 2.62 3-pt FG per game) and assists (7th, 3.74 APG). He turned in one of the league's virtuoso performances of the season when he dished out a conference-record 18 assists against Mercer on February 24 to go along with 29 points and eight rebounds. The 18 assists set an A-Sun record, were one off the school record and were the second-highest single-game total in Division I in the last two seasons.

Bucs on the Tube

Along with the new ASun.TV package which will video stream all ETSU men's and women's home games on the Internet, the Bucs will again have a significant presence on the television screen as well this year ... In fact, plans are for ETSU's trips to Oklahoma State (Dec. 8) and Syracuse (Dec. 15) to air locally, with the Oklahoma State game showing on WAPK and the Syracuse contest airing on WKPT ... The Bucs will also appear on regional cable through the Friday's night CSS Atlantic Sun Game of the Week with the Jan. 25th trip to Jacksonville and the Feb. 1 home game against Mercer scheduled for air on CSS ... In addition, Charter Main Street will air its weekly ETSU replay on Charter 13 and Comcast 14 Tuesday nights at 8 p.m., with the weekly games beginning on Nov. 20th ... Chilton's No. 42 comes out of retirement

JOHNSON CITY, Tenn.

(Aug. 31, 2007) – For many years, **Tom Chilton's** No. 42 has held a special place in ETSU basketball's history. Next season, fans will see that special number on the floor once again ... Chilton, who ranks first all-time with 26.1 points per game and fifth on the all-time scoring list with 1,801, has agreed to allow junior transfer **Kevin Tiggs** (Flint, Mich.) to wear his No. 42 jersey for the 2007-08 and 2008-09 season. Chilton, who now



makes his home in Madison, Ind., said he was honored a current player would want to wear his number ... "I wish him the best and I'm honored he wants to wear No. 42," said Chilton, whose 42 is the only retired number in ETSU's program history. "I hope he always considers that the number doesn't make the player, but the player makes the number. A lot of hard work and effort went into that number during my time there, but ETSU gave a lot back to me and I wouldn't be where I am today without that university, so I'm happy to allow the number to be worn again." ... ETSU head coach **Murry Bartow** said he was appreciative Chilton would allow the number to come out of retirement, and he reiterated that the number will go back into retirement two years from now ... "Tom Chilton was one of the finest players to ever wear an ETSU uniform, and his willingness to allow Kevin to wear the number shows he is still proud to be a part of our program's tradition," Bartow said. "It's our expectation that Kevin understand the importance of the number and the responsibility that goes with wearing it." ... Tiggs, the 2007 National Junior College Division II Player of the Year, said he certainly understood the history behind the number ... "Mr. Chilton was and is a legend here, so wearing his number comes with a great deal of responsibility," Tiggs said. "I just want to play in a way that would make him proud."

Home Sweet Dome

Since the 1996-97 season, the Buccaneers are an amazing 107-36 inside Memorial Center, good for a winning percentage of 75 percent ... ETSU had won five straight at Memorial Center during the 2006-07 season before a loss to Belmont (1/2) ... The Bucs then rattled off 10 straight at home to stand at 15-1 on the Memorial Center floor this season, but fell to Belmont in the final game of the year in the championship of the A-Sun Tournament.

1,109 wins and counting

With a win Jan. 25 against Belmont, the Bucs collected the program's 1,100th win all-time ... In over 80 years of basketball, the Bucs are 1,109-891-27 all-time after dropping Lipscomb on March 2.

"Assist"-ance please

With three assists against Lipscomb in the semifinals of the 2007 A-Sun Championships, ETSU sophomore guard **Tayloe Taylor** (Memphis) reached 102 assists on the season, joining teammates **Courtney Pigram** (Memphis) and **Dequan Twilley** (Shelbyville) with more than 100 assists on the year ... For the Bucs, it was the first time in ETSU history that three or more players had 100 assists or more in a single season ... By the end of the year, Pigram led the way with 127 assists, Twilley had 112, and Taylor finished with 102 ... For the year, all three players rank among the A-Sun leaders in assists, with Twilley sixth at 4.0 apg and Pigram seventh with 3.7.

Smith the go-to guy at the end

With an 80 percent shooting mark from the free throw line, sophomore guard **Mike Smith** (Vandalia, Mo.) has become the guy the Bucs look to when they are icing games in the final minutes ... Despite being a freshman a year ago, Smith's icy demeanor equated to a free throw percentage that ranked fifth in the A-Sun -- 79.6 percent.

Stealing is not a bad thing

ETSU's defensive pressure continues to thwart many offensive schemes, relying primarily on an aggressive style that creates steals and turnovers ... The formula once again had the Bucs among the national leaders in steals during the 2006-07 season ... The Bucs finished the year ranked sixth as a team nationally with 9.9 steals a game, while sophomore guard **Courtney Pigram** (Memphis) ranked 11th on the individual steal list with 2.6 a contest ... The Bucs grabbed 10 or more steals in 14 of their last 21 games ... The team twice collected a season high 17 thefts.

Bucs getting defensive

When looking back at the Bucs' improvements last season, the clear difference has been ETSU's ability to improve defensively ... In 2005-06, ETSU struggled to hold teams at bay on the offensive end of the floor, giving up a high shooting percentage to opponents and needing to score a lot of points to win ... In 2006-07, the opposite was true, as the Bucs rank as one of the A-Sun's top defensive squads ... In fact, nationally the Bucs rank sixth in steals per game with with 9.9 a contest, while ranking 39th for blocked shots (4.6 bpg) and 19th in field goal percentage defense (39.9% per game) ...
