**About the Bucs:** The Bucs host Georgia Southern this weekend in their first Southern Conference home series ... ETSU played its first SoCon series of the season this past weekend, taking two of three games against Furman in Greenville, S.C. ... The Bucs were scheduled to play Tennessee on Wednesday night, but the game was rained out and rescheduled for April 12 ... East Tennessee State enters the Georgia Southern series with their best start (11-2) in at least 22 seasons and opened their SoCon schedule by taking two of three at Furman last weekend ... The offense has been led by senior second baseman Nick Crowe, sophomore left fielder Stephen Douglas and senior catcher Caleb Moore ... Crowe leads the team with a .388 batting average and has four home runs and eight RBIs ... He hit leadoff home runs in two out of the three games at Furman and has hit leadoff homers three times this season ... Douglas is second on the team with a .371 batting average and also has 12 RBIs and six runs scored ... Moore is batting .354 and leading the team with five home runs and 21 RBIs ... Junior shortstop Chuck Hargis has been on fire from the plate, hitting .542 (13-for-24) in his last six games to raise his average to .385 ... Hargis also has a homer, nine RBIs and eight runs scored ... The Buccaneer pitching staff has also been strong, as Jeremy Hall and Steven Calicutt both pitched well to begin the season ... Hall is 3-0 with a 3.86 ERA and leads the team with 28.0 innings pitched and has 16 strikeouts ... Calicutt is 2-2 with a 4.33 ERA and has struck out 15 batters in 27.0 innings ... Moore has also pitched well out of the bullpen, allowing no runs on four hits in 8.1 innings of work ... In seven appearances this season, he is 2-0 with five saves ... The Bucs finished 28-30 last season, 15-15 in SoCon play ... ETSU had an explosive offense last season, led by Moore, Byrne and junior first baseman Shane Byrne ... Moore led all NCAA Division I players with a .455 batting average while hitting nine homers and driving in 45 runs ... He also led the team with 59 runs scored ... Church hit .353

with eight home runs, leading the team with 53 RBIs ... Byrne also had a stellar season, batting .330 with six homers, 39 RBIs and 13 stolen bases ... The pitching staff will be anchored by Hall, who led the Bucs with a 9-8 record last season ... Hall led all starters with a 5.95 ERA while pacing the team with 104.1 innings pitched ... He also leads all returning Buccaneer pitchers with 57 strikeouts last season ... Senior Trevor Smith was valuable out of the bullpen last season, going 2-0 with a 4.30 ERA in 26 appearances ... Moore will serve as the Buccaneer closer for the second-straight season after going 2-0 with six saves and a 3.60 ERA in 2004.

**Scouting the Eagles:** Georgia Southern has won seven of their last eight games and is currently on a four-game winning streak ... The Eagles are 10-7 on the season and 3-0 in SoCon play after sweeping Davidson last weekend from Statesboro, Ga. ... GSU defeated No. 17 Georgia Tuesday night, giving them two wins in three games against the Bulldogs ... GSU has faced some tough competition early this season, in addition to Georgia, the Eagles have also faced Georgia Tech four times ... The Eagles feature a potent offense, with five players hitting over .360 this season ... Jason Hurst leads the team with a .457 batting average and also paces the club with 18 RBIs ... Greg Dowling is hitting .439 with Flint Wipke at .373, James Payne at .365 and Logan Phillips at .361 ... Derrick Smith leads the team with six home runs while Wipke has hit five homers ... Payne leads the team with 15 stolen bases and has only been thrown out twice ... The Eagles also have some talented pitchers, led by sophomore lefty Everett Teaford ... Teaford is 3-1 with a 3.11 ERA and has struck out 42 hitters and has only walked 10 in 37.2 innings of work ... He allowed just three hits over seven innings in a GSU 4-1 win over Georgia on Feb. 26 ... Josh Lairsey is 3-1 with a 6.14 ERA and Dustin Evans is 2-3 with a 5.88 ERA ... Steve Cogswell has pitched well out of the bullpen, going 2-1 with four saves in 10 appearances ... Georgia Southern head coach Rodney Hennon is 202-121-1 in five-plus seasons at the school and has a career-record of 283-159-1 in just over seven total seasons as a collegiate head coach ... Hennon coached for two seasons at Western Carolina prior to becoming the GSU head coach in 2000.

**Against Georgia Southern:** East Tennessee State has faced Georgia Southern 53 times with the Eagles holding a 37-16 advantage ... Georgia Southern won two out of three from the Bucs in Statesboro, Ga. last season and have won five the last six games between the two teams ... ETSU head coach Tony Skole has a 4-11 record against GSU.

**The Last Time Out:** East Tennessee State played their first Southern Conference series of the 2005 season, taking two out of three from Furman last weekend in Greenville, S.C. ... In Friday night's game one, the Bucs entered the top of the seventh down 4-3, but proceeded to send 12 batters to the plate, scoring seven runs ... The Bucs then held on for a 10-8 victory over the Paladins ... The rally was highlighted by ETSU freshman third baseman Anthony Russell's first collegiate home run, a two-run blast over the centerfield wall ... Junior righty Jeremy Hall allowed four earned runs over 7.1 innings on six hits to earn his third win of the season ... He also walked four batters while striking out two ... The Bucs were led at the plate by Nick Crowe and Chuck Hargis ... Crowe went 4-for-6 with two runs scored and an RBI while Hargis was 3-for-3 with two runs scored and an RBI ... Shane Byrne, Caleb Moore and Anthony Russell also had two hits each in the win ... On Saturday, ETSU moved to 11-1 as they edged Furman, 15-14 ... The Bucs made another furious rally, outscoring Furman 12-5 between the fifth and seventh innings after being down 7-3 ... The Bucs scored three runs in the fifth, three more in the sixth and six runs in the seventh ... ETSU freshman lefty Joey McCown pitched one-third of an inning in the sixth to earn his first collegiate win ... Moore earned his fifth save of the season, pitching the final 1.1 innings and allowing one hit ... The save gave Moore 12 in his four seasons at ETSU, breaking the school record ... Crowe, Stephen Douglas and Hargis led the Bucs at the plate with two hits while Byrne paced the team with four runs scored ... Blake Church and Douglas had three RBIs in the win ... The Bucs fell to Furman, 7-4 in the finale of the three-game series on Sunday ... Buccaneer junior lefty Steven Calicut was charged with the loss after allowing seven runs on 11 hits in 6.2 innings pitched ... The Bucs were led at the plate by Crowe, Byrne, Moore and Douglas who each had two hits on the day ... Moore led the team with two runs scored while four players had an RBI.

**The Last Time Against Georgia Southern:** East Tennessee State lost two out of three games in a Southern Conference series at Georgia Southern Mar. 12-14 of last season from Statesboro, Ga. ... ETSU righty Jeremy Hall was tremendous in game one Friday night, silencing the potent GSU offense ... Hall allowed just one unearned run in a 4-1 complete-game victory ... After allowing two hits and the only Georgia Southern run in the first inning, Hall retired the next 13 batters that he faced ... He also allowed two hits in the fifth, one in the seventh and two in the ninth ... Hall struck out six batters while walking none in improving to 4-2 on the season ... Just three Eagle base runners advanced past first base in the final eight innings ... First baseman

Blake Church, second baseman Josiah Glafenhein and catcher Caleb Moore all collected two hits each for the Bucs in the win ... In game two, Georgia Southern collected 16 hits in defeating East Tennessee State 14-7 ... Shane Byrne gave the Bucs a 1-0 lead in the top of the first with his third home run of the season, but GSU starter Brian Harrison retired the next 13 ETSU batters while his offense built a seven-run lead ... The Bucs would never close the GSU lead to less than five ... Freshman designated hitter Stephen Douglas led East Tennessee State with two hits and three RBIs in three plate appearances while Byrne was one-of-two with two RBIs ... Georgia Southern's offense erupted in Sunday's third game, scoring 15 runs in the first four innings of play, then cruised to a 20-7 victory ... The Bucs were led at the plate by Glafenhein and Douglas, who had three hits each.

**Home Sweet Home:** The Bucs have been very successful from Cardinal Park in Johnson City in Coach Skole's five-plus seasons ... ETSU has gone 82-54 from Cardinal Park since the 2001 season while tallying a 33-106 record away from home ... ETSU was 19-10 at home last season and was 11-13 in 2003.

**Crowe Comes Home:** Senior infielder Nick Crowe, a graduate of Science

Hill High School in Johnson City, has transferred to ETSU for his senior season after three years at Tennessee ... Crowe hit .299 over the last three seasons at UT, including a .301 average last season ... He also had two home runs, 21 RBIs, 35 runs scored and was 10-of-12 on stolen base attempts in 2004 ... Nick showed his versatility during his three seasons in Knoxville, playing first base, second base, third base and catcher ... At Science Hill, Nick was a three-time all-state selection and was a member of the state championship team in 1999 ... Two years later he was an all-tournament selection for the USA Junior National team that won a silver medal at the Pan-American Tournament in Cuba ... Crowe was named the top newcomer in the Southern Conference by *Baseball America* and was also named as one of the conference's top-10 MLB draft prospects by the publication ... Crowe has gotten off to a hot start for the Bucs, leading the team with a .388 batting average, hitting four homers, scoring 16 runs and driving in eight others through his first 12 games.

**Moore Looks to Repeat:** Buccaneer senior catcher/pitcher Caleb Moore had one of the best seasons in Southern Conference history in 2004 and looks to match the feat this season ... Moore led all NCAA Division I players with a .455 batting average and .60 doubles per game ... In addition, he led the SoCon in slugging percentage (.752) and was second in on-base-percentage (.509), third in total bases (152) and fourth in hits (92) ... Caleb also hit nine home runs, had 45 RBIs and scored 59 runs ... He earned SoCon Player of the Year honors by both the leagues coaches and media and was a 2004 second-team Louisville Slugger All-American ... Prior to this season, Caleb was selected as a first-team Louisville Slugger Preseason All-American ... He has been named preseason Southern Conference Player of the Year by *Baseball America* and *Collegiate Baseball* ... He was also named as one of the top-10 draft prospects in the conference by *Baseball America* ... Was also named as the best athlete in the conference and the catcher with the best arm by the publication ... After going hitless in his first game of the season, Moore has caught fire, raising his average to .354 with five home runs, 21 RBIs and 12 runs scored ... He is also 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA and five saves in seven appearances on the mound this season.

**Church Chat:** ETSU junior first baseman Blake Church was the Bucs' best run producers last season, and was ETSU's most improved hitter ... Church was third on the team with a .353 batting average and led the club with 53 RBIs ... Blake also scored 40 runs and hit eight home runs on the season ... Church also led the Bucs with 14 multi-RBI games in 2004 ... Church is batting .267 with four doubles, two triples, nine RBIs and eight runs scored so far this season.

**Among the NCAA Leaders:** ETSU senior catcher Caleb Moore led all NCAA Division I players in two categories in

## THE HEAD COACH



**Tony Skole** is in his sixth season as the Buccaneer head coach. After five seasons at the helm of the Bucs' program, the Roswell, Ga., native has brought a sense of optimism and respect to East Tennessee State baseball.

Along with being a great teacher of the fundamentals, Skole and his staff have already ensured that Buccaneer baseball will become a power in the Southern Conference and compete on a national level. All five of his recruiting classes at ETSU have been ranked among the nation's best by *Collegiate Baseball* magazine.

In Skole's first five seasons of rebuilding the baseball program, the Bucs have gone 119-167 overall, 67-84 in the always-tough Southern Conference. Coach Skole already has ETSU playing at a highly competitive level, with 51 of the Bucs' losses over the last five-plus seasons coming by two runs or less.

Prior to becoming the head coach at ETSU, Skole served in the same capacity at Lincoln Memorial University. While at Lincoln Memorial, Skole turned a mediocre NAIA program into a nationally ranked NCAA Division II program. At LMU, Skole coached 20 All-Conference players, three All-Americans and 25 All-Academic honorees.

Seven of his former players at LMU were taken in the Major League Baseball Draft. Two of those players, **Scot Shields** and **Brad Voyles** (both right-handed pitchers), made it up to the big leagues for their first time during the 2001 season. Shields is with the Anaheim Angels and pitched in and won a World Series Championship in 2002, and Voyles is with the Kansas City Royals. Skole led his LMU team to a 95-57 (.630) record in three years. His squads were ranked as high as 13th in the country. Before becoming head coach Skole served as an assistant coach at LMU from 1992-1996.

Skole graduated from The Citadel in 1991 where he established himself as one of the most popular athletes in the school's recent history. Skole enjoyed a career on both the baseball diamond and football gridiron. In baseball, Skole helped guide the Bulldogs to two Southern Conference Championships, an Atlantic Regional Championship, and a berth in the 1990 College World Series in Omaha, Nebraska. It was Skole's home run versus the University of Miami in the Atlantic Regional Championship game which propelled The Citadel into the College World Series. Skole's good fortune followed him to Omaha as he had the game-winning hit in the 12th inning to defeat Cal State Fullerton in The Citadel's second-round victory.

2004 ... Moore led the nation with a .455 batting average and .60 doubles per game ... Caleb also finished 10th in the country with a .752 slugging percentage.

**Spreading the Wealth:** With the resurgence of the Buccaneer offense over the last year, there are few holes in the ETSU lineup ... The Bucs hit .310 as a team in 2004, and had five regular players hit over .300 ... Eight Buc players had at least five home runs while seven scored at least 25 runs ... Seven Buc players drove in at least 25 runs ... This season, five regular players are batting .321 or better, six players have scored at least eight runs and six players have driven in at least eight runs through the team's first 13 games.

**Moore Completes the Trifecta:** Buccaneer junior catcher/relief pitcher Caleb Moore was effective at the plate, behind the dish and on the mound during the 2004 season ... Hitting, Moore led NCAA Division I players with a .455 batting average and .60 doubles per game, and also had nine home runs, 59 runs scored, a .509 on-base percentage and a .752 slugging percentage ... He also drove in 45 runs while leading the team with 27 multi-hit games ... Caleb led the Southern Conference in batting average, total bases, on-base percentage and slugging percentage ... On the mound, Moore served as ETSU's closer, appearing in 12 games last season ... Excluding his first appearance against South Florida, Moore pitched 13.1 innings and allowed just two earned runs on eight hits while picking up two wins and six saves ... Moore earned saves last season against Xavier, Radford, Ball State, Elon, Western Carolina and Furman ... Caleb's first collegiate win also came in 2004, against Kentucky on Mar. 3 ... He picked up another win on May 1 against The Citadel.

**Projected Starting Pitchers:** In this weekend's series against Georgia Southern, the Bucs will start junior righty Jeremy Hall on Friday, junior lefty Brian Lovett on Saturday and junior lefty Steven Calicut on Sunday ... This will be the fifth start of the season for each pitcher ... Hall has pitched well in his first three starts, going 3-0 with a 3.86 ERA ... He leads the Buccaneer starters with 28 innings pitched, allowing 25 hits and striking out 16 ... Hall also paced the starters with a 5.95 ERA and 104.1 innings pitched and leads all returning pitchers with 57 strikeouts last season ... Hall was dominant at times last season, winning four-straight decisions early in the year and winning five out of six starts late in the season ... Lovett is 2-0, posting a 7.61 ERA, allowing 20 earned runs on 31 hits while striking out 19 in 23.2 innings of work ... Brian transferred to ETSU this season after pitching two seasons at Tusculum College in Greeneville, Tenn. ... Lovett was 7-3 with a 3.54 ERA in 14 appearances in 2003 ... Last season, Brian went 2-2 with four saves, striking out 21 batters in 22.2 innings pitched ... Calicut has gone 2-2 with a 4.33 ERA in his first five appearances (four starts) ... He has allowed 13 earned runs on 30 hits while striking out 15 in 27 innings ... Steven is a talented lefty that has spent most of his first two seasons in the Buccaneer rotation ... He won five games last season, ranking third on the staff with 85.2 innings pitched and fourth with 49 strikeouts ... The Eagles will counter with lefty Josh Lairsey, righty Dustin Evans and lefty Everett Teaford ... Lairsey is 3-1 with a 6.14 ERA in six appearances (five starts) this season ... He has pitched 29.1 innings, allowing 20 earned runs on 39 hits while walking 16 and striking out 22 ... Evans is 2-3 with a 5.88 ERA in five starts ... Dustin has pitched 26 innings, allowing 17 earned runs on 32 hits while walking 12 and striking out 19 ... Teaford has been excellent on the mound so far this season, going 3-1 with a 3.11 ERA in six starts ... He leads the team with 37.2 innings pitched and 42 strikeouts and has only walked 10 batters ... Teaford has given up 13 earned runs on 37 hits this season.

**Close Games:** The Bucs have developed a tendency to play very exciting baseball games in the last few seasons ... In ETSU head coach Tony Skole's five-plus season tenure, the Bucs have played 94 games that have been decided by two-or-fewer runs ... ETSU is 44-50 in those contests ... ETSU played 15 such games last year, going 9-6 ... The Bucs were 8-11 in such games in 2003 ... The Bucs have gone a perfect 6-0 in such games this season ... All three of ETSU's games in their season-opening series against Niagara were decided by just one run, with the Bucs going 3-0.

**SoCon Preseason Poll:** The Bucs were recently chosen to finish seventh in the Southern Conference in both of the annual conference preseason polls ... College of Charleston was chosen to win the SoCon by both the leagues coaches and Sports Information Directors ... Last season's tournament champion, The Citadel, was chosen to finish second in both polls, followed by Georgia Southern, UNC Greensboro, Elon and Western Carolina.

**Young Bucs:** East Tennessee State has 18 returning players and will showcase 10 newcomers this season ... Several players will have the chance to contribute early, as infielder Nick Crowe is the team's starting second baseman and left-handed pitcher Brian Lovett is in ETSU's weekend rotation.

**Another Strong Incoming Class:** ETSU's 10-player recruiting class was voted as one of the best in the nation by *Collegiate Baseball* newspaper ... Each of the classes recruited by Buccaneer head coach Tony Skole and his staff have earned the honor by the publication ... Joining the Bucs this season are Robbie Campbell, Nick Crowe, Scott Deans, McCay Green, Chuck Hargis, Bubba Herbold, Brian Lovett, Joey McCown, Anthony Russell and Jonathan Stoudt ... Crowe transferred to ETSU after spending three seasons as a starter at Tennessee ... Campbell and Russell were both key players for DeMatha (Md.) High School, one of the best prep programs in the country ... Deans redshirted last season, but .351 during his final full season at Greeneville (Tenn.) High School ... Green pitched one season at Lake Sumter Community College in Florida, and has been selected in the Major League Baseball draft on two occasions ... Hargis was the starting shortstop at Walters

Senior outfielder Richie Billings came to ETSU last season and sophomore pitcher McCay Green is a member of this season's incoming class ... Next season's class will include Justin Aughey, a catcher who is the brother of The Citadel second baseman Jon Aughey.
